Giuliano Amato – Former President of the Constitutional Court of Italy, Former Prime Minister of Italy

Giuliano Amato, born on May 13, 1938, is an esteemed Italian academic and political figure with a diverse career. He served as Prime Minister of Italy twice, from 1992 to 1993 and 2000 to 2001, and played a significant role as Vice President of the Convention on the Future of Europe in drafting the European Constitution. His political acumen earned him the nickname "dottor Sottile." Additionally, he was pivotal as the President of the Italian antitrust authority from 1994 to 1997 and held ministerial positions including Minister of the Interior and Treasury Minister. He has also contributed to academia as full professor at the European University Institute in Florence, at the Università La Sapienza in Rome and other Italian Universities and as visiting professor at the Columbia University and the New York University. Notably, Amato has been a judge on the Constitutional Court of Italy since September 2013 and President of it in the last year of his mandate.
